A word from the IPM Coordinator

- "Be creative about reaching your residents; get to know them.
- Any treatment options must be specific to the level of infestation as well as the tenants' lifestyle, including cultural practices and daily routines.
- Do your best to collaborate with the residents' community support providers.
- If there are language barriers, bring in interpreters or try using pictures to illustrate IPM.
- Work as a team, and empower your residents to take pride in their homes.
- Remember to be patient. These insects are not going to go away over night."
